Nursery - Carle class







This half term the children have been learning all about mini beasts and habitats. The children have been looking after and carefully watching the frogspawn turn into tadpoles, and now nearly to baby frogs! We have explored many different animal habitats from farms, African grasslands, ponds and the woodlands.

The children had lots of fun learning all about the Hungry Caterpillar and all the foods he ate! They made some wonderful pictures of butterflies and caterpillars using their handprints. The children also learnt about healthy and unhealthy foods and enjoyed sorting all the healthy and unhealthy foods in to two groups.

Thank you to you all for attending our Inspire Together with the focus on numbers. The children had fun making fruit kebabs with Miss Gear, making sure they counted all the fruits they were using. Please continue to carry on doing the hard work at home with your children it really does make a big difference.

Finally the children absolutely loved getting involved in all the festivities for the Royal wedding, they made cakes and sandwiches for our Royal wedding picnic. It was lovely to see all the children looking so smart on Friday.

Reception - Sharratt & Waddell classes

Reception have had a fantastic half term finding out about the seaside. In literacy the children have been exploring writing stories and have written some 'Sharing a shell 'stories using the story maps they created. The children have also explored writing for different purposes including writing postcards and lists of things to take to the beach.

As part of our topic we looked closely at rock pools and talked about the different sea creatures and plants that we might find in rock pools, the children then went on to create their own.





In art the children explored different techniques and media whilst creating some very detailed observational drawings of flowers including lilac and bluebells. They were so beautiful we made them into this fantastic display.

The children really enjoyed our educational visit to Gore farm. They explored life cycles of farm animals and then had great fun meeting all the animals. Holding chicks and cuddling lambs is going to be an experience that I'm sure they will never forget.





This half term the children have worked very hard, doubling larger numbers and subtracting and adding using 100 squares, number lines and multilink. They have also applied their understanding to solving problems. They have become increasingly skilfull at recording, using the correct signs, + - and =. We have also revisited shape, both 2D and 3D, naming them and describing them in terms of faces, corners and edges. We have been very impressed by their perseverance.

We enjoyed our Inspire sessions which were focused around Maths and the story Handa's Surprise. It was lovely to see so many of you there. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Year 1 - Bond & Potter classes







At the beginning of this term the children went on an animal adventure to Axe Valley Wildlife Park. During this trip the children enjoyed learning about the different animals, which included lemurs, zebras and meerkats. Some of the children were even brave enough to handle a snake and a tarantula!

These first-hand experiences allowed the children to create amazing recounts about their adventures and a thirst for writing 'Guess Who' poetry, inspired by the 'Monkey Puzzle' story, by Julia Donaldson. Some of these are now displayed in our school hall.

The enthusiasm for learning these animal facts continued with a science led theme for non-fiction writing. Mammals, birds and reptiles are a few types of animal that the children have been learning to identify and describe. Ask your child to impress you with their favourite animal fact.

In Maths, Year 1 children began by looking at different groups of numbers and identified how to make each group equal by adding more. The children then had the opportunity to explore and understand how to find half and a quarter of shapes and numbers. This was done through lots of practical activities including making pretend pizzas, which you can see on Tapestry.

Afterwards, the children delved into learning vocabulary for giving directions and explored moving around in the playground, with their peers, using words such as; forwards, backwards, left and right. Once confident with this the children developed their learning, thinking about positional language. This involved identifying where shapes and objects were in relation to others e.g. the ball is next to the box or the red circle is above the green triangle.









Year 2 - Cole & Donaldson classes







In Year 2 this half term the

children have enjoyed our 'Where the Wild Things Are' topic. They created their own wild things and described them. They changed parts of the story to make it their own more unique versions. The children have made fact files about weird little monsters which included a Venus Flytrap.







We spent a week on activities based on 'The Enormous Crocodile'. The children created their very own 'Roly Poly' birds from character descriptions. They loved having their parents and grandparents in during our 'Inspire Together' maths session. Many of the children commented on how much they enjoyed it. Finley left the class that day stating "that was the best day ever".

Some of the children have been to Sunningdale Lodge with Mrs Gulliver to sing to the elderly people. Mrs Gulliver has been so proud of the way that the children have put so much effort into learning the words and showing off their good behaviour out of school.

Well done to all of the children for completing their SATs. They showed great perseverance and enjoyed the challenge.
